Martin Richardson has been at the ANU since 2003. Obtaining his PhD in Economics at Princeton University, Martin has taught at Georgetown University in Washington DC and the University of Otago in New Zealand as well as at the Australian National University (ANU). He has published in international trade and applied microeconomics and has been an academic visitor at, *inter alia*, the University of Toronto, the Université de Montréal, the University of Copenhagen Business School, University College Dublin, the University of Tübingen, McGill University, the University of British Columbia and Hitotsubashi University. He was first appointed as a Lay Member of the NZ High Court in 2001. In July 2024 he became an Emeritus Professor at the ANU.
