# STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT FINANCES IN QUEENSLAND 1859-1982

Researchers are often frustrated by the lack of conveniently accessible and consistently defined statistics of Queensland government finances. This paper is designed to overcome those difficulties. It presents, over long periods, simplified series of state and local government revenues and total expenditures that are reasonably consistent, together with notes on the definitions used and the inconsistencies that still exist. The series themselves are preliminary, in the sense that their value depends entirely on their utility to potential users. The author would therefore welcome comments from those who work with them.

Stare and local government tables of sources and purposes of revenues and expenditures run from 1859 and 1860 to 1968 and 1967, respectively; tables of the integrated accounts of all state and local government authorities from 1963 to 1982. The earlier coverage of colonial/state government finances is restricted to transactions on the two main accounts used by Treasurers: Consolidated Revenue Fund, to which most current receipts were credited and from which most current payments were made; and the Loan Fund through which borrowed moneys were channelled. Transactions effected through Trust Funds or other Special Accounts and those of semi-government bodies are not included, a matter of increasing importance through the twentieth century. Tables for the 1963 to 1982 period, in contrast, amalgamate all funds through which the Public sector finances were operated.

It is essential to note that expenditure figures for colonial/state governments to 1968 presented here are (with the exception of one column - debt charges) totals of CRF and net loan payments, net of transfers between the two funds.

#### SOURCES

Figures for revenues and expenditures of colonial and state governments, 1859-1906, have been estimated from The Public Accounts of the Colony of Queensland published annually in Parliamentary Papers either in conjunction with the report of the Auditor-General or separately. For 1907 to 1968 they are those published annually in Commonwealth Bureau of Census and Statistics (CBCS), State Territory and Local Government Authorities' Finance and Government Securities 1967-68 (Reference 5.11) and its predecessor, Finance Bulletin.

Receipts and outlays, 1963-82, are latest published figures in Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS)State and Local Government Finance Australia 1981-82 (Catalogue No. 5404.0) and predecessors.

Public debt outstanding has been taken from The Public Accounts for the years 1859 to 1900; for 1901 to 1975 from Mrs Pat Brown's compilation, basically from Finance Bulletin, held in the Department of Economic History, RSSS, Australian National University; and for 1976 to 1982 from Budget Paper No. 8, Commonwealth Budget Papers, 1982/83.

Taxation collections are from The Public Accounts, Auditors-General's reports and Statistics of the Colony of Queensland for 1880 to 1929; from latest figures published in CBCS, State Territory and Local Government Authorities' Finance and Government Securities 1967-68, Table 8, and predecessors, for 1930 to 1968. Because ABS, Taxation Revenue Australia 1981-82 (Catalogue No. 5506.0) and earlier issues is a convenient source of relatively long-run figures, no details of taxation 1963-82 are given here.

Local government finances to 1914 are from G.H.Knibbs, Local Government in Australia (Government Printer, Melbourne, 1919). For 1915 to 1967 they are from CBCS, State Territory and Local Government Authorities' Finance and

Government Securities 1967-68 and predecessors.

## OTHER OFFICIAL COLLECTIONS

Ten-year tables appear in Statistics...of Queensland setting out colonial/state government revenues from 1867 (first appearing in the 1876 issue), current account expenditures from 1894 (1903 issue) and loan expenditures from 1897 (1906 issue). For many years the revenues reported are not netted for refunds made; CRF expenditures are categorised by departments rather than by purposes; and loan expenditures are gross, without adjustment for sums credited to Loan Fund on account of repayments, interest receipts and sales of assets. For these reasons they have not been called on here.

The Commonwealth Grants Commission published, in its <u>Reports</u>, tables of state expenditures on social services and debt charges which, because they capture transactions excluded from this compilation, may be more useful for specialist work.

#### THE TABLES

The consistency of definition that these figures may claim derives largely from the fact that there are few categories, that most are wide, and that inconsistencies evident in the finer Finance Bulletin classifications can be avoided.

#### TABLE 1

In the colonial/state government revenue and expenditure tables, 1859-1968, figures refer to transactions taking place within the stated year and not those relating necessarily to the parliamentary appropriation of that year. However, from 1875 until late in the nineteenth century expenditures on account of a year ending 30 June but paid between then and 30 September are unavoidably included.

The source lacks detail for 1917, 1918 and 1920. Revenue figures have been added from The Public Accounts; the difficulties of replicating expenditure figures shown in Finance Bulletin, however, mean that only expenditure totals have been inserted.

Definitions used in the tables are:

- Col. 1 <u>Public debt</u> is that outstanding at the end of the financial  $y_{ear}$  indicated. Notionally it includes short-term debt for which securities  $h_{ave}$  been issued but it is likely that some may be omitted before 1901. There is a break in the series between 1900 and 1901.
- Col. 2 Apparent surplus is that produced by subtracting Consolidated Revenue Fund expenditure (not presented in these tables) from revenue (Col.8).
- Col. 3 Taxes include all direct and indirect taxation credited to CRF.
- Col. 4 <u>Businesses</u> comprise the earnings of railways, postal and telegraph services (to 1901) and 'other public services' 1907-35. The meaning of this latter, <u>Finance Bulletin</u>, category is quite uncertain. It is retained here to enable comparison with other states where it does include some business enterprises. State industrial, pastoral, retail and other minor undertakings are included only to the extent that they contribute revenue to CRF. Harbour management, which might properly be regarded as business, is excluded because <u>Finance Bulletin</u> figures include other, unrelated receipts.
- Col. 5 Land is receipts from land sale and leases (including the interest component on credit sales), timber leases and forestry, mining revenues including royalties and various fees associated with each.
- Col. 6 Other is an heroic amalgamation, bringing together separable items such as interest, fees and fines, harbours and all other receipts except

commonwealth grants.

- Col. 7 Commonwealth are the payments made by the commonwealth government (other than for services rendered) and credited to CRF.
- Col. 8 Total revenue is on account of CRF only. It includes transfers from Trust Funds but excludes transfers from Loan Fund. (Note that while the transfer from Railway Reserve Fund is included in 1880 that in 1881, described by Statistics...of Queensland as from the same source but in fact from Loan Fund, has not.) Before 1868 the figures are not netted for refunds of revenue.

In this Table CRF and loan expenditures are aggregated. The latter are net of credits and repayments between 1867 and 1874 inclusive and after 1906.

- Col. 9 Debt charges are interest (and exchange) on the public debt, together with sinking fund payments, redemptions from CRF, and debt management costs.
- Col. 10 Businesses has the same coverage as col. 3 and comprises both operational costs met from CRF and construction and building costs met from loan or CRF sources.
- Col. 11 Other public works includes CRF and loan expenditures on harbours, rivers and roads and public buildings not elsewhere included; also includes loans and grants to roads boards and shire councils for roadworks.
- Col. 12 <u>Social</u> is, again, a very broad aggregation. It covers current and loan expenditure on health and education services, libraries and art galleries and research (except to the extent that some agricultural research is included in col. 14) and on buildings associated with them. It also covers care of Orphans, young children, and the aged, assistance to charitable organisations, and unemployment relief.

- Col. 13 <u>Law and defence</u> includes police, courts, prisons, public safety and delinquent children (both from 1936) together with defence and  $_{\rm war}$  expenditures and associated buildings.
- Col. 14 Primary is expenditures on land, stock and agriculture, water and soil conservation, closer settlement and assistance to primary industries.
- Col. 15 Other includes mining and assistance to that industry.
- Col.16 <u>Total expenditure</u> is the sum of CRF and net loan expenditures, net of transfers between them.

#### TABLE 3

For the amalgamated state and local finance series, 1963-1982, the the current surplus or deficit is not represented. The source instead lists various sources from which the gap between current receipts and total outlays was met. These are shown in columns 22-24. These statistics are all cast in the mould of national income accounting. A major implication is that some receipts are netted against some related outlays; other implications are mentioned below. Reference should be made to the source for detailed information.

- Col. 17 Public debt includes a break in the series between 1975 and 1976.
- Col. 18 <u>Taxes</u> includes fees and fines. Some fees have been netted against outlays on relevant services.
- Col. 19 <u>Businesses</u> have a wider coverage than in the 1859-1968 tables because those conducted outside the framework of CRF and Loan Fund are included: especially semi-government authorities. On the other hand the figures reported are (a) that part of the income of government financial enterprises paid to general government and (b) the 'net operating surplus' of government trading enterprises, excluding interest received and before interest charges

are met.

- Col. 20 Property income is interest, rent, royalties and dividends received (other than dividends included in column 19).
- Col. 21 Grants are those from the commonwealth government to state and local government authorities, for all purposes. (State grants to local authorities disappear on amalgamating the accounts.)
- Col. 22 Advances from the commonwealth government, for all purposes, to state and local authorities.
- Col. 23 Borrowing is net borrowing by state general government, state public trading enterprises and local government authorities.
- Col 24 Other financing items comprises net receipts of private trust funds held by government, reduction in cash and bank balances, reduction in security holdings, depreciation allowances established in public trading enterprises and other sources of funds (including errors and omissions).

#### Col. 25 Total funds

#### TABLE 4

- Col. 26 Final consumption expenditure on goods and services netted for offsetting fees and charges for services rendered and sales of goods and services by general government.
- Col. 27 New assets acquired whether for replacement or additions by general government, state public trading enterprises and local government authorities; includes maintenance as well as construction of new roads.
- Col. 28 Existing assets/stocks is net expenditure on existing assets, mainly

land and buildings, together with changes in the balance of stock accounts, including those of public trading enterprises.

- Col. 29 Interest excludes payments between authorities aggregated in the table and are primarily those to the commonwealth government on account of advances and to other sectors for borrowings from them.
- Col. 30 Personal benefits are cash benefits to persons in the form of pensions etc and unfunded employee retirement benefits.

#### Col. 31 Subsidies

- Col. 32 <u>Grants</u> are those for private capital purposes for example, for the construction of homes for the aged or of libraries in private schools.
- Col. 33 Advances consist not only of loans and credit made available to the private sector but also to public financial enterprises, including in the latter capital contributions and provision of funds for on-lending.
- Col. 34 <u>Total outlays</u> includes transfers overseas (very minor, if any), a category not shown separately in the table.

#### TABLE 5

Local government finances, 1860-1914, cover municipalities, divisions and shires, Brisbane and country waterworks, harbour boards and fire brigades.

- Col. 35 Rates include not only general municipal property rates but also those levied by municipal waterworks.
- Col. 36 Grants are those from the colonial/state government.
- Col. 37 <u>Business</u> is the sales and charges revenue of waterworks and harbour boards i.e., excluding rates and miscellaneous revenue.

 $_{\text{Col}}$   $_{38}$   $_{\underline{\text{Other revenue}}}$  includes miscellaneous business revenue and, most  $_{\text{probably}},$  loan receipts.

## Col 39 Total revenue

- Col. 40 <u>Works/services</u> encompass general municipal works, such as roads construction and maintenance, health and sanitary services, including loan expenditures.
- Col. 41 Business includes all expenditure by enterprises in Col. 38.
- Col. 42 Other includes administrative expenses and debt charges.

#### Col. 43 Total expenditure

#### TABLE 6

Coverage and definitions of local government finances change after 1914. The former becomes restricted to local government authorities narrowly defined and to the business enterprises directed, ultimately, from municipal chambers. From 1915 to 1935 businesses are not reported separately in the source. It is unclear where their revenues were included, though it may have been in 'Other', nor whether the coverage was extended in 1936. Loan receipts and expenditures are not separately specified before 1936 and Finance Bulletin acknowledges some expenditures were omitted before that date. Consequences of these changes are noted below.

- col. 44 Rates are general municipal property rates only.
- Col. 45  $\underline{\text{Other rates}}$  are special purpose rates and, from 1939, rates levied by  $\underline{\text{municipal business}}$  undertakings.
- Col 46 Business, available from 1936, are total business revenues for 1936-38

and business sales and charges revenue thereafter.

Col. 47 Grants are from state government.

Col. 48 Other includes loan receipts (insofar as they were recorded) to 1936 and possibly revenues of businesses to 1936 and 'other' revenues of businesses from 1939.

#### Col 49 Total revenue

Col. 50 Works/services is the expenditure, including that from loans, on municipal works and services other than those of business undertakings.

Col. 51 <u>Debt charges</u> are primarily interest and sinking fund payments and, fom 1939, include those of business undertakings.

Col. 52 <u>Business</u>, from 1939, exclude debt charges but include loan expenditure.

Col. 53 Other includes administration and before 1936 may include expenditure by businesses.

#### Col. 54 Total expenditures

#### TABLE 7

Taxation figures presented in these tables differ from those shown earlier in that they include collections not carried to the credit of CRF but applied to special funds (for example that of the Main Roads Commissioner) for designated expenditure purposes. For 1859-1929:

Col. 55 Customs includes excise duties and export taxes on gold.

Col. 56 Income tax includes dividend tax.

Col. 57 Land tax

Col. 58 Stamp duty covers all stamp duties, the sources not distinguishing between stamps used to pay probate and succession and other duties.

Col. 59 Motor taxes includes driving licences, registration fees and allied collections.

Col. 60 Gambling taxes are those levied on totalisator transactions.

Col. 61 Liquor taxes are licence fees on wholesaling and retailing liquor.

Col. 62 Licences to undertake various other forms of business.

Col. 63 Total

For 1930-68:

Col. 64 <u>Income taxes</u> include dividend tax, unemployment relief tax and state development tax.

Col. 65 Land tax

Col. 66 Probate

Col. 67 Other stamp duties

Col. 68 Motor taxes

Col. 69 Gambling taxes include lottery and entertainment taxes.

Col. 70 Liquor taxes

Col. 71 Other taxes include licences not elsewhere included.

Col. 72 Total

#### DATING

For the years 1859 to 1874 the Queensland government closed its books on 31 December. It then changed to 30 June, so that 1875 data relate to the  $\sin x$  months ending on that date.

Local government figures for 1860-1914 are said to be for years terminating on 31 December. In order to preserve comparability with other states' statistics, and following the aggregating policy adopted in <a href="Finance Bulletin">Finance Bulletin</a>, 1946-47 Table 90, figures for 1915-33 are those of 31 December of the <a href="previous year">previous year</a>; for 1934, 1935 and 1937, 31 December the preceding year except for Brisbane, 30 June current year; 1936, 31 December current year, except for Brisbane 30 June current year; 1938-67, 30 June - with 'years' of different length in 1938. Note that <a href="Finance Bulletin">Finance Bulletin</a> data for 1935 were discarded. These ugly changes merely reflect ugliness in the original form of presentation but do not appear, even in 1915, to distort the figures.

#### **CORRIGENDA**

The following definitions should be amended.

P.4 Col.4 Businesses The first seven lines of this definition should be amended as follows:

Col. 4 Businesses comprise the earnings of railways and, to 1901, of postal and telegraph services. They exclude those state industrial, pastoral, retail and other minor undertakings which, contributing revenue to CRF at least on occasions, would have been reported (1907-35) in *Finance Bulletin* category 'Other public services'. 'Other business and industrial undertakings' so described in the source are included from 1936.

#### P.5 Col. 10 Businesses Add:

Also included are loan expenditure on water and sewerage and, from 1962, on electricity.

#### P.5 Col. 12 Social Add:

Loan expenditure on housing excludes that under the Commonwealth States Housing Agreements. Loan expenditure on unemployment relief works (-8 in 1933 is the only entry) is included in col. 11 (Other public works).

### P.6 Col. 14 Primary Add:

Loan expenditure on mining is included from 1907.

### P.6 Col. 15 Other add:

Includes CRF expenditure on Finance Bulletin category 'Other public works' consisting primarily of servicing and repairing public buildings.

Definitions of cols (71) and (72) on page 12 should read:

Col. 71 Other taxes include licences not elsewhere included, 'other taxes' and, in 1968, other government authorities' taxation and profits of state lotteries.

Col. 72 Total excludes Fire Brigade Contributions by insurance companies first reported in the source in 1968 and probably not previously included.
